

REFUNDS SCHEDULED FOR MUSIC FESTIVAL

People who were prevented from using their tickets to the Woodstock Music and Arts Fair in Bethel, N. Y., last August will be able to get refunds up to a total of \$15,000, State Attorney General Louis J. Lefkowitz said yesterday.

The \$15,000 will come from the personal funds of John P. Roberts, the 24-year-old President of the corporation that sponsored the music festival, which drew 300,000 people.

Because of the crowds and the clogged highways, some ticket-holders were unable to get to the festival grounds. Their complaints to the Attorney General's office prompted discussions with Mr. Roberts that led to the present agreement.

Mr. Lefkowitz said that refunds would be made to anyone who filed a complaint, followed up by an affidavit, before Dec. 8. The claims should be sent to Assistant Attorney General David Clurman, 80 Centre Street, New York City.
