

2 at Woodstock Festival Charged With Bad Checks

MONTICELLO, N. Y., Aug. 24—Two concessionaires who sold nearly \$100,000 worth of supplies at the Woodstock Music and Arts Festival two years ago have been indicted on eight counts of grand larceny in connection with the issuance of allegedly fraudulent checks.

The sealed indictments against Jeffrey Joerger and Charles F. Baxter, both of New York City, were opened by Sul-

livan County Judge Benjamin Newberg yesterday. Mr. Joerger was the only defendant to appear in court, pleading not guilty to the charges against himself and a company called Food for Love, Inc. A bench warrant has been issued for Mr. Baxter's arrest.

District Attorney Louis B. Scheinman said the indictments accused the two men of issuing nearly \$20,000 of bad checks. The Coca-Cola Company of New York and the New York Telephone Company were among the companies that received worthless checks, according to the prosecutor.
