

A Toilet Cleaner Loses Suit Over 'Woodstock'

NEWARK, Nov. 17 (UPI)—A maintenance man shown cleaning toilets in the film "Woodstock" had his suit for damages for invasion of privacy denied yesterday.

The claim was filed in Federal District Court here by Thomas Taggart, 56 years old, Keyport, who said his privacy had been violated when he was featured in a segment of the film about the 1969 rock festival.

A jury ruled that Mr. Taggart had appeared in the film voluntarily and was therefore not entitled to damages.

In the film, Mr. Taggart, who works for the Port-O-San Corporation in Kearny, is shown cleaning out a portable latrine. He says, "I'm glad to do it for those kids. I've got a son here, and another one in Vietnam, flying helicopters."
